Our Ministries For Worship

Ministers of Hospitality

Hospitality ministers/Ushers are the first friendly faces that you see upon entering our church. They take up the collection and hand out bulletins at the end of Mass.

Golf Cart Ministry

Golf Cart Ministers drive our cart to help the handicapped and elderly at each of our liturgies. Must be licensed and 18 years of age.

Sacristan

Sacristans are responsible for the overall preparation for liturgical celebrations. Specific duties include: Preparing the Holy Eucharist for the celebration of the Mass. This includes readying the wine, water and bread and putting them in place before the start of Mass.

Altar Servers

Altar Servers come from the youth in our parish, 4th grade and up, who are trained to aid the priest and deacon with duties at the altar.

Choir/ Cantors/ Musicians

The Adult Choir sings for the 10:30 am Mass and the Youth Choir sings at school liturgies. Both sing for Christmas & Easter Masses. Cantors lead the congregation in song. Musicians enhance special celebrations throughout the year.

Readers

Readers are responsible for delivering the Word of God to the assembly.

Extraordinary Ministers of Communion

Extraordinary Minister of Communion are parishioners trained to distribute the Body and Blood of Christ to the faithful, including the homebound.

Art & Environment

This creative team ensures that the worship space is visually appropriate and liturgically correct during the year through the use of flowers, banners, etc.

Journeying Through Grief

Journeying through Grief is a set of four short books to send to grieving people at four crucial times during the first year they have lost a loved one. Each of the four books focuses on the feelings and issues a person is likely to be experiencing at that point in their grief, offering comfort, help, and hope throughout that first difficult year.

In 2021 a committee began sending the books to a family member of deceased parishioners of Holy Trinity Catholic Church. The committee welcomes new volunteers interested in continuing this ministry to grieving people.

Who's My Neighbor Committee

The Parish Council created the Who's My Neighbor Committee in January 2021 with a goal of reaching out to the homebound parishioners – primarily seniors in the parish. The committee mails birthday cards to parishioners who are aged 80 and older. Other activities include delivering gift bags to homebound seniors at Christmas and Easter. From time to time, the committee calls individuals to inquire about any needs they might have that the parish can assist with.

One of the goals of the committee was to connect groups in the parish to assist in the ministry to seniors. School students created Christmas cards and Easter drawings to include in the gift bags. Other groups involved include St. Ann's & the Confirmation class. The committee welcomes new volunteers interested in assisting in this ministry to seniors.
